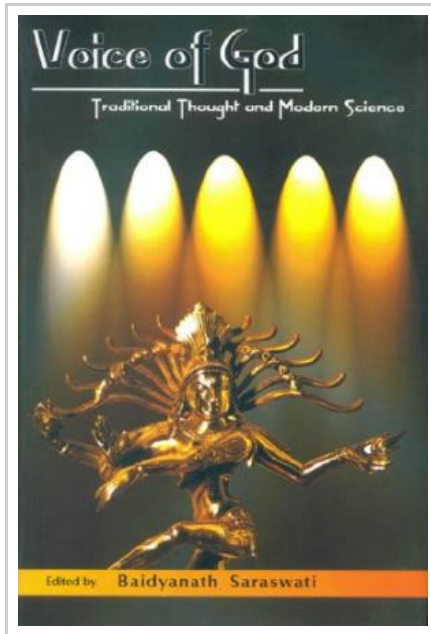




Voice of God: Traditional Thought and Modern Science
